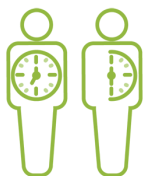

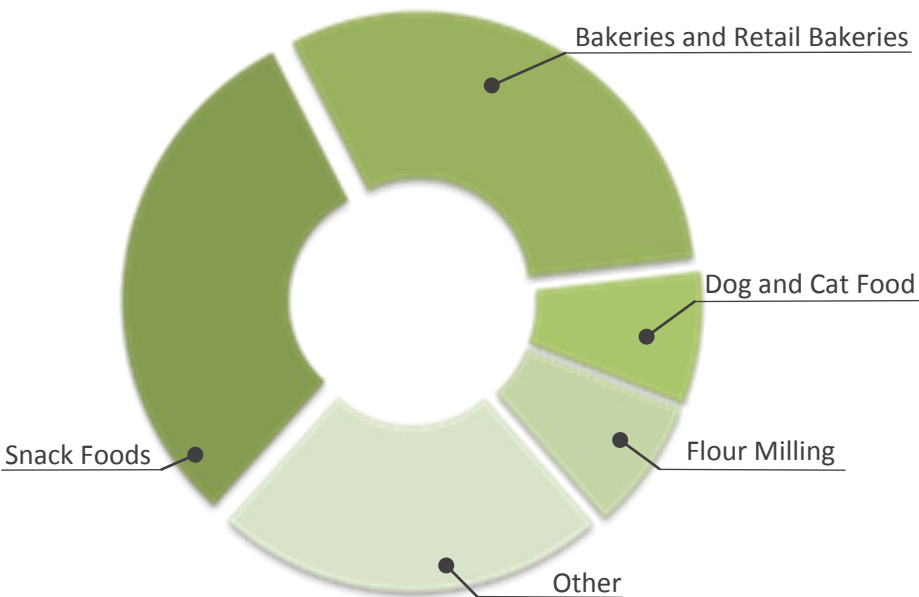
TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT
